The old law decreed that dedications should be honoured in splendour; even more should the new also be honoured. For as Isaiah proclaims, "The islands are made new for God." By this we understand the churches now built by the nations which receive a firm foundation from God. Therefore let us spiritually celebrate this present feast.

S5: O Lord, I have waited for you for your name's sake; my soul has waited for your word, my soul has hoped in the Lord.

O brothers, be renewed! After you have put away the old man, live in newness of life. Bridle everything from which death may come. Let us discipline all our members and hate every evil fruit of the tree. As we remember it, let us avoid our ancient errors so that the human race may be restored in this way. So the day of dedication is honoured.

S4: Let Israel hope in the Lord from morning watch until night, from morning watch.

O Christ, the pre-eternal Word, you set up your church as a tower of strength and founded it on the rock of the faith. Therefore it remains unshaken for ever in you, for you became unchangeably man in these latter times for its sake. Therefore we give thanks, praise you and say. "You are our King since before time began, now and for ever. Glory to you!"

Prophecy 2

The joy of Wisdom - Poetic

From the Book of Proverbs (3:19-34)

God by wisdom founded the earth, and by prudence he prepared the heavens. ²⁰ By understanding were the depths broken up, and the clouds dropped water. ²¹ O son, do not let them pass from you, but keep my counsel and understanding, ²² so that your soul may live, and there may be grace around your neck. From the Book of Proverbs (9:1-11)

Wisdom has built a house for herself, and set up seven pillars. ² She has killed her sacrifices; she has mingled her wine in a bowl, and prepared her table. 3 She has sent out her servants, calling with a loud proclamation to the feast, as though in a hollow, saying: 4 Whoever is foolish, let him turn aside to me; and to those who want understanding she says: ⁵ Come, eat my bread, and drink wine which I have mingled for you. ⁶ Leave folly and seek; search for wisdom so that you may live. Improve understanding by knowledge. ⁷ The one who disciplines evildoers will obtain dishonour for himself. The one who rebukes an ungodly man will disgrace himself. ⁸ Do not rebuke evildoers, in case they hate you. - 1: Moses inscribed the invincible weapon of the cross on the waters and marked a straight line before him with his staff. He divided the Red Sea and opened a path for Israel who went over dry shod. Then he marked a second line across the waters, united them in one and overwhelmed the chariots of Pharaoh. Therefore let us sing to Christ our God, for he has been glorified.
- 3: The rod of Aaron is an image of this mystery; it comes into bud to show who should be priest. So the wood of the Cross has now flowered in the Church that once was barren. It has filled her with strength and steadfastness.

Yet neither the fury of wild beasts nor the roaring of the fire could frighten the three children. As they stood together in the flame and were fanned by the wind that brought refreshment like the dew, they sang, "Blessed are you and praised above all, our God and the God of our fathers!"
