VESPERS

Lord I have cried

S6: O Lord, if you mark offences, who will stand?

But there is forgiveness with you.

O almighty *Lord*, Jesus, our God, when the doors were shut and the disciples were assembled, you suddenly entered. You stood in their midst, gave them peace and filled them with the Holy Spirit. You ordered them to remain and on no account to leave Jerusalem until they had been clothed with power from above. Therefore we cry to you, “Glory to you, our Illumination, Resurrection and Peace!”

S5: O Lord, I have waited for you for your name’s sake;

my soul has waited for your word,

my soul has hoped in the Lord.

my soul has hoped in the Lord.

O Lord, eight days after your resurrection you appeared to your disciples in the place where they had gathered. When you had said to them, “Peace be with you, “ you showed your hands and spotless side to the unbelieving disciple. He was convinced and cried to you, “Glory to you, my Lord and my God!”

S4: Let Israel hope in the Lord

from morning watch until night,
from morning watch.

O Christ, Thomas, called the Twin, was not with them when you entered *at the time* when the doors were shut, therefore he did not believe what was told him for the confirmation of faith from unbelief. O Good *Lord*, you did not refuse to show him your spotless side, and the wounds in your hands and your feet. When he had touched and seen, he acknowledged you as not simply God, yet not merely man. He cried to you, “Glory to you, my Lord and my God!”

S3: For there is mercy with the Lord
and abundant redemption with him.

He will redeem Israel from all his offences.

O Saviour, since the disciples hesitated, you came on the eighth day *to the place* where they were gathered together. You gave them peace and cried to Thomas, “O Apostle, come here and probe the palms in which they fixed the nails.” O beautiful unbelief of Thomas which led the hearts of the faithful to knowledge! He cried out with fear, “Glory to you, my Lord and my God!”

Tone 2

S2: Every nation, praise the Lord;
every people, acclaim him!

O Lord, after your resurrection, when the disciples were gathered together and the doors were shut, you stood in their midst and gave them peace. O Lover of mankind, Thomas was also convinced by the sight of your hands and side and he acknowledged you as the Lord and God who saves those who place their hope in you.

S1: For his mercy is strengthened over us
and the truth of the Lord remains for ever.

When the doors were shut, Jesus came to the disciples and gave them boldness and peace. Then he said to Thomas, “Why do you not believe me, for I have risen from the dead? Reach your hand here, thrust it into my side and see. Everyone has learnt about my passion and resurrection through your unbelief and will cry, “Glory to you, my Lord and my God!”

Unbelief has become firm faith, for Thomas said, “Unless I see, I will not believe.” When he had probed the side, he acknowledged the Son of God as God incarnate; he recognised that he had suffered in the flesh. He proclaimed the risen God and cried with the lamp of his voice, “Glory to you, my Lord and my God!”

O amazing wonder! The grass which touched the fire is safe, for when Thomas put his hand into the fiery side of Jesus, who is Christ and God, he was not consumed by touching him. He changed the doubt of his soul into true faith with fervour. He cried out from the depths of his soul, “You are my Master and my God; glory to you, for you have been raised from the dead!”

S2: For he has strengthened the bars of your gates.

O amazing wonder! John leant on the breast of the Word, but Thomas was found worthy to handle his side. The former drew with fear the depth of Theology and dispensation, while the latter was found worthy to initiate us, for he clearly provided proofs of your resurrection as he cried out, “Glory to you, my Lord and my God!”

1: It is the day of Resurrection; O people, let us be radiant. It is Pascha, the Pascha of the Lord, for Christ our God has made us pass from death to life and from earth to heaven. We sing the triumphal song. “Christ is risen from the tomb.”

7: The one who set free the children from the furnace, becomes man and suffers as a mortal. The one who is the only blessed and most glorious God of our fathers clothes the mortal through suffering with the splendour of incorruption.

8: Let us praise, bless and worship the Lord.

This is the chosen and holy day, the first of Sabbaths, the Queen and Lady, the Feast of Feasts, and the Festival of Festivals, on which we bless Christ for ever.

¹⁴ And more than ever believers were added to the Lord, multitudes both of men and women, ¹⁵ so that they even carried out the sick into the streets,

Gospel

From the Holy Gospel according to John (20:19-31)

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being shut where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ²⁰ When he had said

this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." ²² And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." ²⁴ Now Thomas, one of the twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in his hands the print of the nails, and place my finger in the mark of the nails, and place my hand in his side, I will not believe." ²⁶ Eight days later, his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. The doors were shut, but Jesus came and stood among them, and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side; do not be faithless, but believing." ²⁸ Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹ Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me, Thomas? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe." ³⁰ Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; ³¹ but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in his name.

Tone 1

Let us praise the Theotokos in songs, for she is the bright candle, the most wonderful glory and is higher than all creation.

Shine, shine, O new Jerusalem, for the glory of the Lord has dawned on you. O Sion, dance now and rejoice and you, O pure Theotokos, also rejoice at the resurrection of him whom you bore.

Communion

Receive the Body of Christ;
partake from the Fountain of immortality. Alleluia!
