Father before all ages and became incarnate from the Virgin Mary.
When he had endured the cross, he was buried, as he himself
desired. When he rose from the dead, he saved me, for I had
strayed.

S9: The just will wait for me until you reward me.
Christ our Saviour nailed the bond against us to the cross; he made
it of no effect and destroyed the power of death. We fall down
before his resurrection on the third day.

S8: O Lord, I have cried to you from the depths;
O Lord listen to my voice.
Together with the archangels, let us praise the resurrection of Christ.
He is our Saviour and Redeemer. He is coming with awesome glory
and mighty power to judge the world which he formed.

S7: Let your ears note the voice of my plea.
The angel proclaimed you as the crucified and buried Master. He
said to the women, "Come and see the place where he lay. He has
risen, as he said, for he is almighty." Only immortal *Lord*, we
worship you. O Christ, Giver of life, have mercy on us.

keepers of Hades saw you, they were afraid, for you demolished the

Tone 4

S4: Let Israel hope in the Lord from morning watch until night,

Let us joyfully sing the praises of Chrysóstom. *He is* the golden
trumpet, the divinely-inspired organ, the inexhaustible sea of
doctrine, the pillar of the Church, the heavenly mind, the depth of
wisdom and the gilded vase. He pours out sweet streams of
teaching like honey for the refreshment of the world.

S2: Every nation, praise the Lord;
every people, acclaim him!
Let us worthily honour John Chrysóstom. He is the perpetually-
shining star who enlightens every nation with the rays of true

teaching, the preacher of repentance and the golden sponge which
wipes away the despair of sadness. His words are a refreshing dew
which revive hearts worn out by sin.

S1: For his mercy is strengthened over us
and the truth of the Lord remains for ever.

Let us praise Chrysóstom with joyful hymns. *He is* the earthly
angel and heavenly man, the sweet and well-tuned harp, the treasury
of virtues, the immovable rock, the example for the faithful, the
imitator of the martyrs, the resident with the holy angels and the
companion of the apostles.

Glory: Tone 4

O Chrysóstom, you should never have been compelled to leave the
Queen of Cities and go into exile in Komana. Therefore a royal
festival brought you back into the palace under divine inspiration.
The Church rejoices when it sees you and cries out in unison, "O
my beauty, glorify the Lord who has returned to me the friend of the
Bridegroom, the support of our faith, the peace of our hearts, the
regard of our honour, the height of humility, the depth of charity,
the treasure of my poverty and the majesty of conversion."
Therefore we implore you, "All-blessed father Chrysóstom, speaker
in the angelic courts, we beg salvation for our souls.

From the Book of Proverbs (Composite)
The memory of the just is with eulogies, and the blessing of the
Lord is on his head. Blessed is the man who has found wisdom, and
the mortal who knows prudence. For it is better to travel for her,
than for treasures of gold and silver. She is more valuable than
precious stones. (Nothing evil can resist her; she is well known to
all who approach her.) All price is not worthy of her. From her
mouth proceeds justice, and she carries law and mercy in her mouth.
O children, listen to me, and I will speak solemn truths. Blessed is
the man who will keep my ways, for my ways are ways of life, and
prayer is prepared by the Lord. Therefore, O men, I warn, and utter
my voice to human sons. For I, wisdom, have lived with counsel
and knowledge, and have called on understanding. I am counsel; I
am prudent and strong. I love those who are friendly with me; and
those who seek me will find grace. O simple, understand subtlety,
and uneducated, take heart. Listen to me, for I will speak solemn
truths, and will unfold right words from my lips. For my throat will
muse on truth, and false lips are an abomination before me. All the
words of my mouth are with justice; there is nothing in them wrong
or perverse. They are all evident to those who understand, and right
to those who find knowledge. For I will teach you truth, so that your
hope may be in the Lord, and you will be filled with spirit.

Prophecy 2*God has visited his chosen ones.*

From the Wisdom of Solomon (4:7-15)

Although the just may be overtaken with death, yet he will be at rest. ⁸ For honourable age is not in length of time, nor what is measured by the number of years. ⁹ But wisdom is the gray hair to people, and an unspotted life is old age. ¹⁰ He pleased God, and was loved by him, so that living among sinners he was taken up. ¹¹ He was snatched, in case evil should alter his understanding, or deceit charm his soul. ¹² For the bewitching of waywardness obscures things that are honest, and the wandering of desire undermines the simple mind. ¹³ Since he was made perfect in a short time, he completed long years, ¹⁴ for his soul pleased the Lord, therefore he hurried to take him away from among the wicked. ¹⁵ The people saw, and did not understand, neither did they perceive that grace and mercy is with his saints, and that he has visited his chosen ones.

Prophecy 3*Give me wisdom that sits beside your throne.*

From the Wisdom of Solomon (Composite)

The mouth of the just distils wisdom; the lips of just men exude grace. The mouth of the wise mutes on wisdom, and justice rescues from death. At the death of a just man his hope does not perish; he will eat the fruit of justice with good things. Light is always for the just and they will pour out grace and glory. The tongue of the wise knows what is good, and wisdom rests in their heart. The Lord loves holy hearts, and all those blameless in the way are acceptable with him. The wisdom of the Lord shines on the face of the intelligent, for she goes before those who desire her, in making herself first known to them, and is contemplated easily by those who love her. Whoever seeks her early will have no great toil, and whoever watches for her will quickly be without care. For she goes around seeking those who are worthy of her, and reveals herself favourably to those on the ways. Vice will not prevail against wisdom. Therefore I became a lover of her beauty. I loved her, and sought her from my youth; I desired to make her my bride. The Lord of all things loved her, for she is privy to the mysteries of the knowledge of God, and a chooser of his works. Her labours are virtues, for she teaches temperance and prudence, justice and fortitude, which are such that men can have nothing more profitable in their life. If a man desires much experience, she knows events in the past and infers what is to come. She knows the subtlety of words and can expound enigmas. She foresees signs and wonders, and the events of seasons and times. She is a counsellor for all in goodness. For there is immortality in her, and good repute in the communion of her words. Therefore I prayed to the Lord, implored him, and said with all my heart. O God of *my* fathers, and Lord of mercy, you have made all things by your word, and put together man in your wisdom, that he should have dominion over the creatures which you have made, and order the world according to equity and justice. Give me wisdom that sits beside your throne; and do not reject me from among your children, for I am your servant, and son of your handmaid. Send her from your holy dwelling, and from the throne of your glory, that being present with me, she may teach me, so that I may know what is pleasing to you. Guide me with knowledge and guard me with her glory. For all the thoughts of mortals are miserable, and their thinking unstable.

The *Lord* who lives for ever said to the inspired prophet, "I glorify the people who glorify me." The one who once exalted Samuel has now glorified this hierarch. After *John* had increased his talent, he returned it to the King who had entrusted it to him. Therefore the Most High *Lord* has highly promoted him. Although I am unworthy, I ask him to give me the grace to sing reverently about him. He is the, the Doctor who teaches the things of God to the entire inhabited earth, the most glorious John Chrysóstom.

Synáxarion

Today we remember the transfer of the relics of our father among the saints, John Chrysóstom, Archbishop of Constantinople, which happened in the Fifth Century. In 438 the remains were brought back from the place of exile in Armenia. The Emperor Theodósios begged forgiveness for his mother Evdoxía who had exiled John. On the Twenty Seventh the city respectfully received your body in a golden reliquary.

Katavasías

1: The sun's rays once shone on dry land in the midst of the deep, for the water on both sides became as firm as a wall while the people crossed over the sea on foot. They offered this song acceptable to God, "Let us sing to the Lord, for he has been greatly glorified."

From the Holy Gospel according to Mark (16:1-8)

When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. ² And very early on the first day of the week they went to the tomb when the sun had risen. ³ And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the door of the tomb?" ⁴ And looking up, they saw that the stone was rolled back; - it was very large. ⁵ And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe; and they were amazed. ⁶ And he said to them, "Do not be amazed; you seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen, he is not here; see the place where they laid him. ⁷ But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him, as he told you." ⁸ And they went out quickly and fled from the tomb; for trembling and astonishment had come upon them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.
