Today the Word of God the Father, the co-eternal Son, whose throne is heaven and whose footstool is earth, humbles himself and comes from Bethany. He is riding on a dumb beast, the foal of an ass. The children of the Hebrews hold branches in their hands. They praise him and cry out, “Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is the one who comes, the King of Israel!” X2

At that time they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Beth'phage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, ² saying to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find an ass tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. ³ If anyone says anything to you, you will say, 'The Lord has need of them,' and he will send them immediately." ⁴ This took place to fulfil what was spoken by the prophet, saying, ⁵ "Tell the daughter of Zion, See, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on an ass, and on a colt, the foal of an ass." ⁶ The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; ⁷ they brought the ass and the colt, and put their clothes on them, and he sat thereon. ⁸ Most of the crowd spread their clothes on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. ⁹ And the crowds that went before him and that followed him shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Gospel

From the Holy Gospel according to John (12:1-18)

Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Laz'arus was, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. ² There they made him a supper; Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at table with him. ³ Mary took a pound of costly ointment of pure nard and anointed the feet of Jesus and wiped his feet with her hair; and the house was filled with the fragrance of the ointment. ⁴ But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was to betray him), said, ⁵ "Why was this ointment not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" ⁶ This he said, not that he cared for the poor but because he was a thief, and as he had the money box he used to take what was put into it. ⁷ Jesus said, "Let her alone, let her keep it for the day of my burial. ⁸ The poor you always have with you, but you do not always have me." ⁹ When the great crowd of the Jews learned that he was there, they came, not only on account of Jesus but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. ¹⁰ So the chief priests planned to put Lazarus also to death, ¹¹ because on account of him many of the Jews were going away and believing in Jesus. ¹² The next day a great crowd who had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. ¹³ So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" ¹⁴ And Jesus found a young ass and sat upon it; as it is written, ¹⁵ "Fear not, daughter of Zion; see, your king is coming, sitting on an ass's colt!" ¹⁶ His disciples did not understand this at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that this had been written of him and had been done to him. ¹⁷ The crowd that had been with him when he called Laz'arus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead bore witness. ¹⁸ The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign.
