O Christ our Saviour, the dominion of death has been shattered by your cross and the deception of the Devil has been destroyed. the human race which has been saved by faith always offers you a hymn.

O Lord, everything has been enlightened by your resurrection and Paradise has been re-opened. The whole creation praises you and continually offers you a hymn.

S8: O Lord, I have cried to you from the depths;
O Lord listen to my voice.

I glorify the power of the Father and the Son, and I praise the authority of the Holy Spirit, the undivided, uncreated Divinity, the consubstantial Trinity who reigns for all time.

S7: Let your ears note the voice of my plea.

O Christ, we bow down in worship before your precious cross. We glorify and praise your resurrection, for we have all been healed by your wounds.

S6: O Lord, if you mark offences, who will stand?

But there is forgiveness with you.

live? What use is the Sheep's Pool to me? I have no one to put me into the pool when the angel stirs up the water. O Fountain of Healing, I come to you. Raise me up so that I may cry to you with everyone, 'Glory to you, almighty Lord!' "

Glory: Tone 5

Jesus went up to Jerusalem and came to the Sheep's Pool, called in Hebrew Bethesda. It had five porches; each was filled with a crowd sick *people*. At certain times an angel of the Lord stirred up the water and the first one who entered the pool in faith was healed. The Lord saw a man there who was grievously afflicted. He said, "Do you want to be whole?" The sick man replied to the Lord, "I have no man to lower me into the pool when the water is stirred. I have wasted my life waiting for healing, but no one has ever seen fit to show me mercy." The Physician of souls and bodies said to him, "Take up your mat and walk. Proclaim my power and great mercy to the ends of the earth."

Both now:

All-honoured *Lady*, how can we not wonder at your giving birth to him who is God and man? For without experience of man, all-spotless One, you gave birth to a son in the flesh who was begotten without mother from the Father before time. He underwent no mingling, change or division, but preserved the attributes of each nature. Therefore, O Lady and Virgin Mother, implore him to save the souls of those who confess you in the Orthodox manner to be the Theotokos.

The Sheep Pool was near one of the gates of Jerusalem; possibly the sacrificial lambs were washed there. It was probably pentagonal in shape since it had five surrounding porches, under which many sick people waited for the water to move. Without help a disabled person was unable to be first in the water, but the divine Power was of greater efficacy than that of moving water. O Christ our God, have mercy on us in your great pity. Amen.

Katavasías

Tone 1

Eothinón Gospel 5

From the Holy Gospel according to Luke (24:12-35)

At that time Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened. ¹³ That very day two of them were going to a village named Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, ¹⁴ and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. ¹⁵ While they were talking and discussing together, Jesus himself drew near and went with them. ¹⁶ But their eyes were kept from recognizing him. ¹⁷ And he said to them, "What is this conversation which you are holding with each other as you walk?" And they stood still, looking sad. ¹⁸ Then one of them, named Cleopas, answered him, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know the things that have happened there in these days?" ¹⁹ And he said to

them, "What things?" And they said to him, "Concerning Jesus of Nazareth, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, ²⁰ and how our chief priests and rulers delivered him up to be condemned to death, and crucified him. ²¹ But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since this happened. ²² Moreover, some women of our company amazed us. They were at the tomb early in the morning ²³ and did not find his body; and they came back saying that they had even seen a vision of angels, who said that he was alive. ²⁴ Some of those who were with us went to the tomb, and found it just as the women had said; but him they did not see." ²⁵ And he said to them, "O foolish men, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! ²⁶ Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" ²⁷ And beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself. ²⁸ So they drew near to the village to which they were going. He appeared to be going further, ²⁹ but they constrained him, saying, "Stay with us, for it is toward evening and the day is now far spent." So he went in to stay with them. ³⁰ When he was at table with them, he took the bread and blessed, and broke it, and gave it to them. ³¹ And their eyes were opened and they recognized him; and he vanished out of their sight. ³² They said to each other, "Did not our hearts burn within us while he talked to us on the road, while he opened to us the scriptures?" ³³ And they rose that same hour and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven gathered together and those who were with them, ³⁴ who said, "The Lord has risen indeed, and has appeared to Simon!" ³⁵ Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he was known to them in the breaking of the bread.

And immediately he rose. ³⁵ And all the residents of Lydda and Sharon saw him, and they turned to the Lord. ³⁶ Now there was at Joppa a disciple named Tabitha, which means Dorcas. She was full of good works and acts of charity. ³⁷ In those days she fell sick and died; and when they had washed her, they laid her in an upper room. ³⁸ Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, hearing that Peter was there, sent two men to him entreating him, "Please come to us without delay." ³⁹ So Peter rose and went with them. Gospel

From the Holy Gospel according to John (5:1b-15)

At that time Jesus went up to Jerusalem. ² Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate a pool, in Hebrew called Bethesdá, which has five porticoes. ³ In these lay a crowd of invalids, blind, lame, paralysed, waiting for the stirring of the water; ⁴ for an angel of the Lord went down at certain seasons into the pool, and stirred up the water; whoever stepped in first after the stirring of the water was made well from whatever disease that person had. ⁵ One man was there, who had been ill for thirty-eight years. ⁶ When Jesus saw him and knew that he had been lying there a long time, he said to him, "Do you want to be healed?" ⁷ The sick man

answered him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is troubled, and while I am going another steps down before me." ⁸ Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your pallet, and walk." ⁹ And at once the man was healed, and he took up his pallet and walked. Now that day was the Sabbath. ¹⁰ So the Jews said to the man who was cured, "It is the Sabbath, it is not lawful for you to carry your pallet." ¹¹ But he answered them, "The man who healed me said to me, 'Take up your pallet, and walk.'" ¹² They asked him, "Who is the man who said to you, 'Take up your pallet, and walk'?" ¹³ Now the man who had been healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, as there was a crowd in the place. ¹⁴ Afterward, Jesus found him in the temple, and said to him, "See, you are well! Sin no more, that nothing worse befall you." ¹⁵ The man went away and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had healed him.
