All-compassionate Word you carried Elijah the Tishbite from the earth in a fiery chariot. Through his prayers save us who glorify you in faith while we celebrate his divine and honourable memory with joy.

my soul has hoped in the Lord.

O Elijah, blessed of God, you saw the presence of God which enlightened you, not in an earthquake, but in a still small voice. You ascended to heaven in a marvellous manner as you sat in a chariot drawn by four horses. O God-inspired *prophet*, you are a wonder for us all.

S4: Let Israel hope in the Lord

O wise Elijah, in your burning zeal for God you slaughtered the priests of confusion with the sword. By your word the heavens were bound so that it might not rain on the earth. By giving your cloak to Elisha he grew and was filled with a double portion of divine grace.

Tone 2

He will redeem Israel from all his offences. Two lights have shone in the inhabited earth; *they are* the bright stars of Elijah and Elisha. One of them stopped the rain from the heavens with the word of God and so convicted the king. He ascended into heaven in a fiery chariot. The other received a double portion of grace. He purified the polluted water and parted the stream of the Jordan. Now they rejoice with the angels and pray for the salvation of our souls.

O never-setting light of the Church, O prophet Elijah, you were ablaze with zeal for God. You made the rain cease from heaven and you were fed by a raven. The widow's jar of flour did not give out because of you, nor did her flask of oil fail; her son was raised from the dead through your prayers. You made fire burn the water and caused the streams of the Jordan to be turned back. You ascended into heaven in a fiery chariot; Elisha received a double portion of your grace. Continually intercede for us before God that he will save our souls.

Glory: Tone 6

Come, all Orthodox people! Let us assemble in the holy place in honour of the two prophets inspired by God. Let us sing together and give glory to Christ our God. Let us raise our voices and say joyfully, "Hail, O earthly angel, and heavenly man, Elijah of great name! Hail O Elisha, for you received double grace from God! Hail, O pillars, champions and

physicians of the Christian people! Rescue from every obstacle and tribulation those who celebrate with faith your all-glorious feast.

Prophecy 1

From the Third Book of Kingdoms (17:1-24)

Elijah the prophet, the Tishite of Tishbe in Gilead, said to Ahab: As the Lord God of hosts, the God of Israel, lives, before whom I stand, there will be no dew or rain during these years, except by the word of my mouth. ²
And the word of the Lord came to Elijah, *saying*: ³ Depart from here towards the East, and hide beside the brook of Cherith that is near Jordan. ⁴
And it will come to pass *that* you will drink water from the brook, and I will order the ravens to feed you there. ⁵ So Elijah acted according to the word of the Lord, and he sat by the brook of Cherith near Jordan. ⁶ And the

ravens brought him loaves in the morning, and flesh in the evening and he drank water from the brook. ⁷ And it came to pass after some time, that the brook was dried up, because there had been no rain upon the earth. And the word of the Lord came to Elijah, *saying*: ⁹ Arise, and go to Zarephath in Sidonia. See, I have there commanded a widow to support you. ¹⁰ So he arose and went to Zarephath and came to the gate of the city. See, a widow was there collecting sticks. Elijah cried after her and said to her: Fetch me, I pray you, a little water in a vessel, so that I may drink. ¹¹ So she went to fetch it. Then Elijah cried after her and said: Bring me, I pray you, a piece of the bread that is in your hand. ¹² But the woman said: *As* the Lord your God lives, I have no loaf, but only a handful of meal in the container, and a little oil in a cruse, and, see, I am going to collect two sticks, then I will go in and prepare it for myself and for my children, then we will eat it and die. ¹³ And Elijah said to her: Be of good courage, go in and act in accordance with your word, but make me from it a little loaf, and you must bring *it* out to me first, then you must prepare *some* for yourself and your children last. ¹⁴ For thus says the Lord: The vessel of meal will not fail, and the cruse of oil will not diminish, until the day that the Lord gives rain on the earth. ¹⁵ So the woman went and did *so*. She ate, she, he and her children. ¹⁶ The container of meal did not fail and the cruse of oil was not diminished, in accordance with the word of the Lord which he spoke by the hand of Elijah. ¹⁷ And it came to pass afterwards, that the son of the woman, the mistress of the house was sick; and his sickness was very severe, until there was no breath left in him. ¹⁸ And she said to Elijah: What have I to do with you, O man of God? Have you come to me to bring my sins to remembrance, and to kill my son? ¹⁹ And Elijah said to the woman: Give me your son. And he took him from her bosom, and took him up to the room in which he himself lodged, and laid him on the bed. ²⁰ And Elijah cried aloud, and said: Alas, O Lord, the witness of the widow with whom I lodge, you hast caused evil *for her* in killing her son. ²¹ And he breathed on the child three times, and called on the Lord, and said: O Lord my God, let, I pray you, the soul of this child return to him. ²² And it was so, and the child cried out, ²³ and he brought him down from the upper chamber into the house, and gave him to his mother; and Elijah said: See, your son lives. ²⁴ And the woman said to Elijah: See, I know that you *are* a man of God, and the word of the Lord in your mouth *is* true.

Prophecy 2

From the Third Book of Kingdoms (18:1, 17-24, 19:1-14)

It came to pass after many days, that the word of the Lord came to Elijah in the third year, saying, Go, and appear before Ahab, and I will bring rain upon the face of the earth. It came to pass that when Ahab saw Elíjah, Ahab said to Elíjah: Are you the one who troubles Israel? ¹⁸ And Elíjah said: I do not trouble Israel, but it is you and your father's house, because you forsake the Lord your God and have gone after Baals. ¹⁹ Now send and assemble all Israel to me at Mount Carmel, with the four hundred and fifty prophets of shame, and the four hundred prophets from the groves that eat at Jézebel's table. ²⁰ So Ahab sent to all Israel and assembled all the prophets to Mount Carmel. ²¹ Elíjah approached all of them and Elíjah said to them: How long will you limp on both feet? If the Lord be God, follow him, but if Baal, follow him. And the people did not answer a single word. ²² So Elíjah said to the people: I am left, the only remaining prophet of the Lord; the prophets of Baal are four hundred and fifty men and the prophets from the groves four hundred. ²³ Let them give us two oxen, and let them choose one for themselves, cut it in pieces, lay it on the wood, but put no fire on the wood. And I will prepare the other bullock and put no fire on it. ²⁴ You must call loudly on the name of your gods and I will call on the name of the Lord my God, and it will come to pass that the God who answers by fire is God. All the people answered and said: The word which you have spoken is good. ²⁵ Elíjah said to the prophets of shame: Choose for yourselves one calf, and prepare it first, for you *are* many. Then call on the name of your god, but put no fire to it. ²⁶ So they took the calf, prepared it, and called on the name of Baal from morning till noon, and said: Hear us, O Baal, hear us. But there was no voice and no one answered, so they ran up and down on the altar which they *had* made. ²⁷ It was noon and Elíjah the Tishbite mocked them, and said: Call with a loud voice, for he is a god; perhaps he is thinking or perhaps he is engaged in business. Perhaps he is asleep and must be awaked. ²⁸ So they cried with a loud voice, and, according to their custom, cut themselves with knives and lancets until the blood gushed out over them. ²⁹ And they prophesied until evening came, then it came to pass that, as it was the time for the offering of the sacrifice, Elíjah the Tishbite spoke to the prophets of the abominations, saying: Stand aside for the present and I will offer my sacrifice. So they stood aside and left. ³⁰ And Elíjah said to the people: Come near me. And all the people came near him. ³¹ Then Elíjah took twelve stones, according to the number of the tribes of Israel, as the Lord spoke to him, saying: Israel will be your name. ³² Then he built up the stones in the name of the Lord and repaired the altar that had been broken

down. He made a trench that could hold two measures of seed around the altar.³³ Then he piled the chopped wood on the altar which he *had* made and divided the whole-burnt-offering. He placed *it* on the wood, laid *it* in order on the altar, and said, "Fetch me four pitchers of water, pour *it* over the whole-burnt-offering and over the wood." And they did so.³⁴ Then he said: Do it a second time." And they did it a second time. Then he said: Do it a third time. And they did it a third time.³⁵ So the water ran around the altar and they filled the trench with water.³⁶ Then Elijah cried aloud to the heaven, and said: O Lord God of Abraham, Isaac and Israel, answer me. O Lord, answer me this day by fire, let all this people know that you are the Lord God of Israel, that I *am* your servant, and that for your sake I have accomplished these works.³⁷ Hear me, O Lord, hear me, and let this people know that you are the Lord God and have turned back the hearts of this people.³⁸ Then fire fell from the Lord from heaven, consumed the whole-burnt-offerings, the wood and the water that was in the trench; and the fire licked up the stones and the earth.³⁹ Then all the people fell on their faces, and said: Truly the Lord *is* God; he *is* God.⁴⁰ And Elijah said to the people: Take the prophets of Baal; let not one of them escape. And they took them; and Elijah brings them down to the brook Kishon, and he slew them there.⁴¹ And Elijah said to Ahab: Go up, and eat and drink, for *there is* a sound of coming rain.⁴² And Ahab went up to eat and to drink; then Elijah went up to Carmel, stooped to the ground, and put his face between his knees.⁴³ He said to his servant: Go up, and look towards the sea. And the servant looked, and said: There is nothing. And Elijah said: Then go again seven times.⁴⁴ And the servant went again seven times. It came to pass at the seventh time, that, see, a little cloud like the sole of a man's foot brought water. Then he said: Go up, and say to Ahab, make ready your chariot, and go down, in case the rain overtakes you.⁴⁵ And it came to pass in the meanwhile, that the heaven grew black with clouds and wind, and there was a great rain. So Ahab wept, and went to Jezreel.⁴⁶ And the hand of the Lord *was* on Elijah, and he gathered up his loins, and ran before Ahab to Jezreel.¹ And Ahab told Jezebel his wife all that Elijah *had* done, and how he *had* slain the prophets with the sword.² And Jezebel sent to Elijah, and said: If you art Elijah and I am Jezebel, God do so to me, and more also, if I do not make your life by this time tomorrow like the life of one of them.³ And Elijah feared, rose, and departed for his life. He comes to Bershebah in the land of Judah, and he left his servant there.⁴ He himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat under a juniper tree. He asked about his life that he might die, and said:

Let it be enough now, O Lord, take, I pray you, my life from me, for I am no better than my fathers. ⁵ He lay down and slept there under a tree; and see, someone touched him, and said to him: Arise and eat. ⁶ And Elijah looked, and, see, at his head there was a cake of meal and a cruse of water. He arose, ate and drank, then returned and lay down. ⁷ The angel of the Lord returned again, touched him, and said to him: Arise, and eat, for the journey *is* far for you. ⁸ So he arose, ate and drank, then went in the strength of that meat for forty days and forty nights to Mount Horeb. ⁹ He entered a cave, and rested there, then see, the word of the Lord *came* to him, saying: What are you doing here, Elijah? ¹⁰ And Elijah said: I have been very jealous for the Lord Almighty, because the sons of Israel have forsaken you. They have pulled down your altars, slain your prophets with the sword and only I am left alone; they seek my life to take it. ¹¹ And he said: You must go out tomorrow and stand before the Lord on the mountain. See, the Lord will pass by. Then a great *and* strong wind came which tote at the mountains and crushed the rocks before the Lord, *but* the Lord *was* not in the wind. After the wind came an earthquake, *but* the Lord *was* not in the earthquake. ¹² After the earthquake came a fire, *but* the Lord *was* not in the fire. After the fire came the voice of a gentle breeze. ¹³ And it came to pass that when Elijah heard, he wrapt his face in his cloak, went out and stood in the cave. See, a voice *came* to him and said: What are you doing here, Elijah? ¹⁴ And Elijah said: I have been very jealous for the Lord Almighty, for the sons of Israel have forsaken your covenant, they have overthrown your altars and have slain your prophets with the sword. I am left entirely alone and they want to take my life.

Prophecy 3

From the Third Book of Kingdoms (19:19-21, 4 Kingdoms 2:1, 6-14)
Elijah finds Elisha, son of Saphat, as he was ploughing with oxen; *there were* twelve yoke before him, and he with the twelve, and he passed beside him, and threw his cloak over him. ²⁰ And Elisha left the cattle, and ran after Elijah and said: I will kiss my father, and follow you. And Elijah said: Return, for I have done *a work* for you. ²¹ And he returned from following him, took a yoke of oxen, slew them, and boiled them with the tackle of the oxen. He gave to the people, and they ate: then he arose, went after Elijah, and ministered to him. And it came to pass that when the Lord was going to take Elijah with a whirlwind into heaven that Elijah and Elisha left Gilgal. ² And Elijah said to Elisha: Stay here, I pray you, for God has sent me to Bethel. And Elisha said: *As* the Lord lives and your

soul lives, I will not leave you. So they came to Bethel. ³ And the sons of the prophets who were in Bethel came to Elisha, and said to him: Do you know that the Lord this day is going to take your lord away from over you? And he said: Yes, I know *it*; be quiet. ⁴ And Elijah said to Elisha: Stay here, I pray you, for the Lord has sent me to Jericho. And he said: *As the Lord lives and your soul lives, I will not leave you.* So they came to Jericho. ⁵ And the sons of the prophets who were in Jericho approached Elisha and said to him: Do you know that the Lord is about to take away your master today from over you? And he said: Yes, I know *it*; hold your peace. ⁶ And Elijah said to him: Stay here, I pray you, for the Lord has sent me to Jordan. And Elisha said: *As the Lord lives and your soul lives, I will not leave you.* So they both went on. ⁷ Fifty men of the sons of the prophets *went also* and they stood at a distance from them as they both stood on *the bank* of Jordan. ⁸ And Elijah took his cloak, bunched it up and struck the water. Then the water was divided on this side and on that side, so they both went over on dry ground. ⁹ And it came to pass that while they were crossing Elijah said to Elisha: Ask what I can do for you before I am taken away from you. And Elisha said: Let there be, I pray you, a double *portion* of your spirit on me. ¹⁰ And Elijah said: You have asked for a something hard. If you see me when I am taken up from you, then it will happen to you, but if not, it will not happen. ¹¹ And it came to pass that as they were going, they continued to talk, when, see, a chariot of fire and horses of fire separated both of them. And Elijah was taken up in a whirlwind to heaven. ¹² And Elisha saw, and cried, Father, father, the chariot of Israel, and the horseman thereof! And he saw him no more: and he took hold of his garments, and rent them into two pieces. ¹³ And Elisha took up the mantle of Elijah, which fell from off him upon Elisha; and Elisha returned, and stood upon the brink of Jordan; ¹⁴ and he took the mantle of Elijah, which fell from off him, and smote the water, and said, Where is the Lord God of Elijah? and he smote the waters, and they were divided hither and thither; and Elisha went over.

From the Holy Gospel according to Matthew (16:13-19)

At that time when Jesus came into the district of Caesaréa Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do men say that the Son of man is?"¹⁴ And they said, "Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets."¹⁵ He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?"¹⁶ Simon Peter replied, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."¹⁷ And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jona! synagogue, as they heard these things. ²⁹ They rose up, threw him out of the city, and led him to the brow of the hill that their city was built on, that they might throw him off the cliff. ³⁰ But he, passing through the midst of them, went his way.
