Today we remember the holy great martyr Barbara of Iliópolis who
 lived in the Fourth Century. Her father was angry that she refused a
 rich marriage. After discovering her Christian faith he handed her
 over to the authorities. Together with her we remember Juliana who
 decided to confess her Christianity and stand alongside her. On the
 Fourth Barbara finished her race and reached her goal at the hand of
 her father.

On the same day we commemorate our renowned father John of
 Damascus, monk and priest of the monastery of Sávvas the
 Sanctified, who lived in the Eighth Century. For a time he
 reluctantly served in the court of the Caliph instead of his father.
 However, his place there protected him from the iconoclasts, even
 when he published works in favour of the icons. He wrote "The
 Fount of Knowledge" and compiled the Paraklitiki. After he had
 filled the earth with melodious song he ascended to sing before the
 Lord.

From the Letter of Paul to the Galatians (3:23-4:5)

At that time a great crowd followed Jesus and thronged about him. ²⁵And there was a woman who had had a flow of blood for twelve years, ²⁶and who had suffered much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was no better but rather grew worse. ²⁷She had heard the reports about Jesus, and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his garment. ²⁸For she said, "If I touch even his garments, I shall be made well." ²⁹And immediately the haemorrhage ceased; and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. ³⁰And Jesus, perceiving in himself that power had gone forth from him, immediately turned about in the crowd, and said, "Who touched my garments?" ³¹And his disciples said to him, "You see the crowd pressing around you, and yet you say, 'Who touched me?'" ³²And he looked around to see who had done it. ³³But the woman, knowing what had been done to her, came in fear and trembling and fell down before him, and told him the whole truth. ³⁴And he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease."
