VESPERS

Lord I have cried

Tone 6

O Lord, I have cried to you, listen to me;
O Lord, listen to me.

O Lord, I have cried to you, listen to me;
Note the voice of my plea when I cry to you.
O Lord, listen to me.

² Let my prayer be directed before you like incense,
the raising of my hands be an evening sacrifice.
O Lord, listen to me.

S10: Lead my soul from prison that I may acknowledge your name.

O Christ, you were victorious over Hades. You ascended the cross and raised with you those who sat in the shadow of death, for you are free among the dead and pour out life from your light. O almighty Saviour, have mercy on us.

S9: The just will wait for me, until you reward me.

Today Christ has trampled on death, for he has risen as he said and granted joy to the world, so that we may all sing this hymn, "O unapproachable Light, Source of life, almighty Saviour, have mercy on us."

S8: O Lord, I have cried to you from the depths;

O Lord listen to my voice.

O Lord, where shall we sinners flee from you, for you are in all creation? In Heaven? It is there that you live. In Hades? It is there that you trampled on death. In the depths of the sea? Even there is your hand, O Master. As we flee to you and fall down before you, we pray, "You rose from the dead; have mercy on us."

Tone 6

S7: Let your ears note the voice of my plea.

The Lord ascended to heaven in order to send the Advocate into the world. The heavens prepared his throne and the clouds his royal mount. The angels were amazed when they saw a man exalted. The Father awaits the Son who is eternally in his bosom. The Holy Spirit commands the angels, "O gates, lift up your heads! All you nations, clap your hands, for Christ has ascended to where he was before."

S6: O Lord, if you mark offences, who will stand?

But there is forgiveness with you.

The Cherubim were amazed by your ascension when they saw the God of angels ascending on clouds. We glorify you, for your mercy is good; glory to you, O Lord!

S5: O Lord, I have waited for you for your name's sake;

my soul has waited for your word,

my soul has hoped in the Lord.

O Christ, the splendour of the Father's glory, we praise the likeness of your appearance as we witness your ascension from the mount. We bow in worship before your passion and honour your resurrection. We glorify your glorious ascension. O Lord, have mercy on us.

Tone 6

S4: Let Israel hope in the Lord
from morning watch until night,
from morning watch.

You were begotten from the Father before the Morning Star, but Arius wrongfully taught that you were created. In his ignorance he designated you as a creature, yet the fathers of the council proclaimed you as Son of God, enthroned with the Father and the Holy Spirit.

S3: For there is mercy with the Lord
and abundant redemption with *him*.

He will redeem Israel from all his offences.

O Saviour, who has torn your spotless clothing? Who has challenged the unity of the triune Divinity? It is Arius, for he denied that you are equal to the Father. Those who follow him do not believe that God took flesh for our sake, but the fathers of the council proclaimed you as Son of God, enthroned with the Father and the Holy Spirit.

S2: Every nation, praise the Lord;
every people, acclaim him!

Arius fell into the abyss of sin. He simulated blindness so that he could not see the Light. Through his wilfulness he became the image of Judas, but the council at Nikea proclaimed you as Son of God, enthroned with the Father and the Holy Spirit.

S1: For his mercy is strengthened over us
and the truth of the Lord remains for ever.

The foolish Arius blasphemed the Holy Trinity when he divided the Persons into three different and unequal Beings, but the God-clothed fathers denounced his confusion. They assembled with the zeal of Ilias, destroyed error with the sword of the Spirit and were directed by the inspiration of God.

Glory: Tone 6

Today let us praise the mystical trumpets of the Spirit, the God-bearing fathers, who stand in the midst of the Church. They sing true theology and praise the immutable Trinity. They laid low the errors of Arius and upheld the Orthodox faith. They always plead with the Lord to have mercy on our souls.

Both now: Tone 6

Most holy Virgin, who will not bless you? Who will not sing about your most pure childbearing? O pure *Lady*, the only-begotten Son shone timelessly from the Father, but was ineffably incarnate from you. He was God by nature, but became man for our sake. He was not divided into two persons, but known as one in two natures. O honoured and all-blessed Lady, plead with him to have mercy on our souls.

Phos Ilarón

P/D: Wisdom! Stand upright!
O Jesus Christ, joyful light of the holy glory
of the immortal, heavenly, holy, blessed Father,
when we come to the setting of the sun
and see the light of evening,
we praise God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

For it is right at all times to worship you
with voices of praise,
O Son of God *and* Giver of life.
Therefore the world glorifies you.

Prophecy 1

From the Book of Genesis (14:14-20)

In those days when Abram heard that his kinsman had been taken captive, he led forth his trained men, born in his house, three hundred and eighteen of them, and went in pursuit as far as Dan. ¹⁵And he divided his forces against them by night, he and his servants, and routed them and pursued them to Hobah, north of Damascus. ¹⁶Then he brought back all the goods, and also brought back his kinsman Lot with his goods, and the women and the people. ¹⁷After his return from the defeat of Ched-or-lao'mer and the kings who were with him, the king of Sodom went out to meet him at the Valley of Shaveh (that is, the King's Valley). ¹⁸And Melchiz'edek king of Salem brought out bread and wine; he was priest of God Most High. ¹⁹And he blessed him and said, "Blessed be Abram by God Most High, maker of heaven and earth; ²⁰and blessed be God Most High, who has delivered your enemies into your hand!"

Prophecy 2

The Reading from Deuteronomy (1:8-11, 15-17)

Thus says the Lord: See, I have set the land before you; go in and take possession of the land which the Lord swore to your fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, to give to them and to their descendants after them. ⁹"At that time I said to you, 'I am not able alone to bear you; ¹⁰the Lord your God has multiplied you, and behold, you are this day as the stars of heaven for multitude. ¹¹May the Lord, the God of your fathers, make you a thousand times as many as you are, and bless you, as he has promised you! ¹⁵So I took the heads of your tribes, wise and experienced men, and set them as heads over you, commanders of thousands, commanders of hundreds, commanders of fifties, commanders of tens, and officers, throughout your tribes. ¹⁶And I charged your judges at that time, 'Hear the cases between your brethren, and judge righteously between a man and his brother or the alien that is with him. ¹⁷You shall not be partial in judgment; you shall hear the small and the great alike; you shall not be afraid of the face of man, for the judgment is God's; and the case that is too hard for you, you shall bring to me, and I will hear it.'

Prophecy 3

The Reading from Deuteronomy (10:14-21)

Thus says the Lord: See, to the Lord your God belong heaven and the heaven of heavens, the earth with all that is in it; ¹⁵yet the Lord set his heart in love upon your fathers and chose their descendants after them, you above all peoples, as at this day. ¹⁶Circumcise therefore the foreskin of your heart, and be no longer stubborn. ¹⁷For the Lord your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great,

the mighty, and the terrible God, who is not partial and takes no bribe. ¹⁸He executes justice for the fatherless and the widow, and loves the sojourner, giving him food and clothing. ¹⁹Love the sojourner therefore; for you were sojourners in the land of Egypt. ²⁰You shall fear the Lord your God; you shall serve him and cleave to him, and by his name you shall swear. ²¹He is your praise; he is your God, who has done for you these great and terrible things which your eyes have seen.

Lití

Tone 3

The holy fathers are the renowned keepers of the apostolic tradition. These saints rightly taught about the undivided Trinity. Their assembly dethroned Arius and those with him. The Macedonians who rejected the authority of the Church were convicted. Nestorios, Efthymios, Dioskoros, Savellios and Severus were judged. O Lord, we implore you to rescue us from these powers and to preserve our lives in peace.

Apósticha

Tone 6

O Christ our Saviour, the angels in heaven sing hymns to your resurrection. Enable us who are on earth to glorify you with purity of heart.

S1: The Lord reigns *and* is clothed with majesty;
the Lord has put on power and clothed himself. Ps 92
You destroyed the gates of brass, broke the chains of Hades and raised the fallen human race, for you were almighty God. Therefore we cry out in unison, "O Lord, glory to you who rose from the dead!"

S2: For he founded the world which will not be moved. Ps 92
Christ who desired to restore us after our fall, was nailed to the cross and placed in a tomb. The myrrhbearing women sought him with tears and cried, "Woe to us, O Saviour! How do you stoop to live in the tomb? What place can hide your life bearing body? Come to us as you promised; take away our lamentation and tears." Then the angel appeared to them and cried, "End your lamentation. Go and proclaim to the apostles that the Lord has risen; he grants us pardon and great mercy."

S3: O Lord, holiness is right for your house to length of days. Ps 92
O Christ, you have been crucified as you determined and you captured death by your burial. You rose on the third day as God in glory, and have granted the world eternal life and great mercy.

Glory: Tone 4

Today we celebrate the annual memory of the God-bearing fathers who assembled at Nikea. They laid low the godless doctrines of Arius, drove him from the unity of the Catholic Church and teach us how to acknowledge the consubstantial and co-eternal Son of God. They expressed this clearly in the symbol of faith and we follow their divine doctrines since we believe in and serve the Son with the Father and the all-Holy Spirit, the consubstantial Trinity and unique Divinity.

O Lord, the mystery hidden from the nations before the ages was fulfilled when you brought your disciples to the Mount of Olives. Your mother was present and her maternal suffering at your passion now granted her eternal joy. O Master, we also share in your ascension to heaven and glorify the great mercy which you have shown us.

Mary Magdalene stood beside your tomb and, because she thought that you were the gardener, said with loud lamentation, "Where have you hidden the Eternal Life? Where have you laid the one who sits on the throne of the Cherubim? Those who were guarding him have died with fright. Either give me my Lord or cry out with me, 'Glory to you, for you were among the dead, yet you made the dead rise!'"

Both now:

O Theotokos, Gideon foreshadowed your conceiving and David revealed your childbearing, for the Word descended into your womb like rain on the fleece. O holy *Lady*, full of grace, you brought into flower without seed the Salvation of the world; *he is* Christ our God.

Kathisma 2

Tone 6

Life lay in the tomb and the seal lay over the stone. The soldiers guarded Christ like a sleeping King. When he had invisibly struck his enemies, the Lord rose.

Glory:

O immortal Lord, Jonah prefigured your burial and Simeon foretold your divine resurrection. For you went down as a corpse into the tomb and shattered the gates of Hades. O Christ our God, Enlightener of those in darkness, you rose as Master without corruption for the salvation of the world.

Both now:

O Virgin Theotokos, pray to your Son, Christ our Lord, who was willingly nailed to the cross and rose from the dead so that he might save our souls.

Evlogitária

Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.

The assembly of angels was amazed when it saw you among the dead. O Saviour, by destroying the power of death, you raised Adam with you and freed everyone from Hades.

Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.

The radiant angel cried to the Myrrhbearers from the tomb, "Why do you women mingle myrrh with your tears? Look at the tomb and understand. The Saviour has risen from the tomb."

Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.

The Myrrhbearers ran sorrowfully to your tomb very early in the morning, but an angel came to them and said, "The time for sorrow has come to an end. Do not weep, but announce the resurrection to the apostles."

Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.

The Myrrhbearers were sorrowful as they approached your tomb, but the angel said to them, Why do you number the Living among the dead? As God he has risen from the tomb."

Glory:

We worship the Father, his Son and the Holy Spirit, the Holy Trinity, one in Being. We cry with the Seraphim, "Holy, Holy, Holy are you, O Lord."

Both now:

O Virgin, because you gave birth to the Giver of Life, you rescued Adam from his sin. You gave Eve joy instead of sadness. The Divine Man who was born from you has restored to life those who had fallen from it.

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. Glory to you, O God! X3

O our God and our hope, glory to you.

Without note

The preaching of the Apostles and the teaching of the Fathers strengthened the one faith of the Church, for, because she wore the robe of truth, which was woven from the heavenly divine meditation, she rightly discerns and glorifies the great mystery of true religion.

The new Israel, when he drinks from it, sees God who declares, 'See, see, it is I; I have not changed. I am God the first and the last, and apart from me there is no one else. Those who partake from it will be filled and praise the great mystery of true religion.'"

Today we remember the holy martyr Ermías of Komána who lived in the Second Century. Paul greeted him when he was in Rome. (Romans 16:14) On the Twenty First a sword thrust liberated the flow of his blood's indelible dye.

Ypóm̄nima

Today is the seventh Sunday after Pascha. We celebrate the First Ecumenical Council at Nikea. O Christ our God have mercy on us through the prayers of the 318 God-bearing fathers. Amen.

Katavasías

1: *The man* who had been slow in speech proclaimed the Law written by God when he was covered with divine darkness. He shook the dust away from the eyes of the wise as they saw the Existing *Lord*. After they had attained the knowledge of the Spirit, they praised him with divine songs.

3: Hannah, the prophetess of old, was drawn with a contrite spirit to the mighty God of wisdom; she undid the bonds of an infertile womb and the rebukes of her rival, for she gave birth to a child by her prayer alone.

4: O King of kings, unique Word coming from the only Father without beginning, O Lord, as Benefactor you have sent the Holy Spirit who is equal to you in might, to the disciples who glorify your power.

5: O renowned children of the Church, receive the fiery dew of the Spirit which brings perfect purification from sin, for now the Law has come from Sion. The grace of the Spirit is like tongues of fire.

6: O Master Christ, you are our purification. You have appeared to us from the Virgin and come like the prophet Jonah from the belly of the whale. You rescue all the fallen sons of Adam.

7: Instruments once resounded in harmony in honour of the lifeless golden idol, but the life-bearing grace of the Advocate moves believers to cry, "Blessed are you, O Trinity in Unity! You are without beginning and equal in power!"

8: Let us praise, bless and worship the Lord.

The three-fold radiance of the Divinity moistened the flames with dew and loosened the bonds. Therefore the youths sang to the Creator of all, "Blessed is our only Benefactor and Saviour."

Eothinón Gospel 10

From the Holy Gospel according to John (21:1-14)

At that time Jesus revealed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he revealed himself in this way. ² Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples were together. ³ Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat; but that night they caught nothing. ⁴ Just as day was breaking, Jesus stood on the beach; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. ⁵ Jesus said to them, "Children, have you any fish?" They answered him, "No." ⁶ He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in, for the quantity of fish. ⁷ That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his clothes, for he was stripped for work, and sprang into the sea. ⁸ But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, but about a hundred yards off. ⁹ When they got out on land, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish lying on it, and bread. ¹⁰ Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." ¹¹ So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred and fifty-three of them; and although there were so many, the net was not torn. ¹² Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. ¹³ Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish. ¹⁴ This was now the third time that Jesus was revealed to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.
