and the truth of the Lord remains for ever.

O glorious Nicholas, the holy preacher of Christ, you are the great and fervent protector of those *who are* in danger, *whether* on land *or* at sea, *whether* far off or near, for you are a most compassionate and powerful intercessor. Prophecy 1

From the Book of Proverbs (Composite)

The memory of the just is with eulogies, and the blessing of the Lord is on his head. Blessed is the man who has found wisdom, and the mortal who knows prudence. For it is better to travel for her, than for treasures of gold and silver. She is more valuable than precious stones. (Nothing evil can resist her; she is well known to all who approach her.) All price is not worthy of her. From her mouth proceeds justice, and she carries law and mercy in her mouth. O children, listen to me, and I will speak solemn truths. Blessed is the man who will keep my ways, for my ways are ways of life, and prayer is prepared by the Lord. Therefore, O men, I warn, and utter my voice to human sons. For I, wisdom, have lived with counsel and knowledge, and have called on understanding. I am counsel; I am prudent and strong. I love those who are friendly with me; and those who seek me will find grace. O simple, understand subtlety, and uneducated, take heart. Listen to me, for I will speak solemn truths, and will unfold right words from my lips. For my throat will muse on truth, and false lips are an abomination before me. All the words of my mouth are with justice; there is nothing in them wrong or perverse. They are all evident to those who understand, and right to those who find knowledge. For I will teach you truth, so that your hope may be in the Lord, and you will be filled with spirit.

Prophecy 2

From the Book of Proverbs (10:31-11:12)

The mouth of the just distils wisdom, but the tongue of the unjust will perish. ³² The lips of just men drop grace, but the mouth of the ungodly is perverse. ¹ False balances are an abomination before the Lord, but a just weight is acceptable to him. ² Wherever pride enters, there will also be disgrace, but the mouth of the lowly meditates on wisdom. ³ When a just man dies he leaves regret, but the destruction of the ungodly is speedy and causes joy. ^{4 5} Justice traces out blameless paths, but ungodliness encounters unjust dealing. ⁶ The justice of upright men frees them, but offenders are caught in their own destruction. ⁷ At the death of a just man his hope does not perish, but the boast of the ungodly perishes. ⁸ A just man escapes from a snare, but the ungodly man is delivered up in his place. ⁹ In the mouth of the ungodly there is a snare to citizens, but the discernment of just men is prosperous. ¹⁰ In the prosperity of just men a city prospers, ¹¹ but by the mouth of ungodly men it is overthrown. ¹² A

man without understanding sneers at his fellow citizens, but a sensible man is quiet.

Prophecy 3

From the Wisdom of Solomon (4:7-15)

Although the just may be overtaken with death, yet he will be at rest. ⁸ For honourable age is not in length of time, nor what is measured by the number of years. ⁹ But wisdom is the gray hair to people, and an unspotted life is old age. ¹⁰ He pleased God, and was loved by him, so that living among sinners he was taken up. ¹¹ He was snatched, in case evil should alter his understanding, or deceit charm his soul. ¹² For the bewitching of waywardness obscures things that are honest, and the wandering of desire undermines the simple mind. ¹³ Since he was made perfect in a short time, he completed long years, ¹⁴ for his soul pleased the Lord, therefore he hurried to take him away from among the wicked. ¹⁵ The people saw, and did not understand, neither did they perceive that grace and mercy is with his saints, and that he has visited his chosen ones.

We know you are the Theotokos and we all yearn to seek refuge in your goodness. After childbirth you remained truly a virgin. Only pure *Lady*, we sinners truly have you for protection, and as our salvation in temptation.

The women who came early to your tomb trembled at the sight of the angel. The tomb shone with life and this wonder amazed them. They returned and announced the resurrection to the disciples, “Christ, *who is* alone mighty and powerful, has despoiled Hades. He has raised up all those who are in corruption and released the human race from fear of condemnation through the power of the cross.”

Glory:

The Life of all was nailed to the cross. The immortal Lord, the Saviour who rose on the third day and raised Adam from corruption, was counted among the dead. Therefore, O Giver of Life, the powers of heaven cry out, “Glory to your resurrection! Glory to your condescension, only Lover of the human race!”

Both now:

O Mary, exalted vessel of the Master, raise us who have fallen into a bottomless pit of despair, sin and affliction, for you are the salvation, aid and powerful protection of sinners; you save your servants.

Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.
The assembly of angels was amazed when it saw you among the dead. O Saviour, by destroying the power of death, you raised Adam with you and freed everyone from Hades.

Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.
The radiant angel cried to the Myrrhbearers from the tomb, "Why do you women mingle myrrh with your tears? Look at the tomb and understand. The Saviour has risen from the tomb."

Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.
The Myrrhbearers ran sorrowfully to your tomb very early in the morning, but an angel came to them and said, "The time for sorrow has come to an end. Do not weep, but announce the resurrection to the apostles."

Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.
The Myrrhbearers were sorrowful as they approached your tomb, but the angel said to them: Why do you number the Living among the dead? As God he has risen from the tomb.

Glory:

We worship the Father, his Son and the Holy Spirit, the Holy Trinity, one in Being. We cry with the Seraphim, "Holy, Holy, Holy are you, O Lord."

Both now:

O Virgin, because you gave birth to the Giver of Life, you rescued Adam from his sin. You gave Eve joy instead of sadness. The Divine Man who was born from you has restored to life those who had fallen from it.

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. Glory to you, O God. (X3)

O our God and our hope, glory to you.

For see, he was revealed as *a man* utterly pure and undefiled in spirit. He offered a sacrifice *which was* acceptable to God *and was* without spot or blemish, since he himself was a priest cleansed in soul and body. Therefore he was indeed a leader and champion of the Church; he was blessed as one who has become wise in the grace of God.

Today we remember our father among the saints Nicholas the Wonderworker, Archbishop of Myra in Lykía, who lived in the Fourth Century. He attended the First Oecumenical Council and vigorously opposed Arianism. He devoted himself to charitable work in his busy seaport. On the Sixth he finished his earthly existence.

Eothinón Gospel 4

From the Holy Gospel according to Luke (24:1-12)

On the first day of the week, at early dawn, the women went to the tomb, taking the spices which they had prepared. ² And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but when they went in they did not find the body. ⁴ While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men stood by them in dazzling apparel; ⁵ and as they were frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, the men said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? ⁶ Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, ⁷ that the Son of man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and on the third day rise." ⁸ And they remembered his words, ⁹ and returning from the tomb they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. ¹⁰ Now it was Mary Magdalene and Joanna and Mary the mother of James and the other women with them who told this to the apostles; ¹¹ but these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. ¹² But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.
