Tone 7

O Lord, I have cried to you, listen to me;

Note the voice of my plea when I cry to you.

<sup>2</sup> Let my prayer be directed before you like incense,  
the raising of my hands be an evening sacrifice.  
O Lord, listen to me.

S10: Lead my soul from prison that I may acknowledge your name.  
Come, let us rejoice in the Lord who destroyed the dominion of death  
and enlightened the human race. Let us sing to him with the bodiless  
hosts, "Our Maker and Saviour, glory to you!"

S9: The just will wait for me until you reward me.  
O Saviour, you endured the cross and burial for our sake. As God  
you destroyed death by your death. We fall down before your  
resurrection on the third day. O Lord, glory to you!

S8: O Lord, I have cried to you from the depths;  
O Lord listen to my voice.  
When the Apostles saw the resurrection of the Maker, they were  
amazed and sang the angelic praise, "This is the glory of the Church;  
this is the wealth of the kingdom." O Lord who suffered for our  
sake, glory to you!

S7: Let your ears note the voice of my plea.  
O Christ, you were held by lawless men, but you are my God and I  
am not ashamed. You were struck on the cheek, but I do not deny  
you. You were nailed to the cross and I do not conceal it, for I  
glorify your resurrection and your death is my life. O almighty Lord,  
Lover of the human race, glory to you!

S6: O Lord, if you mark offences, who will stand?  
But there is forgiveness with you.  
Christ fulfilled the prophecy of David and revealed his own greatness  
in Zion to the disciples. He is praised and always glorified, together  
with the Father and the Holy Spirit. At first, as the Word, he was  
bodiless, but later he took flesh and was killed for our sake as man.  
He rose with power, *for he is* the Lover of the human race.

S5: O Lord, I have waited for you for your name's sake;  
my soul has waited for your word,  
my soul has hoped in the Lord.  
O Christ, you descended into Hades as you freely determined; you  
overthrew death as God and Master. You rose on the third day and  
with you raised Adam from the bonds of Hades and from corruption.  
Glory to your resurrection, only Lover of the human race!

Tone 4

S4: Let Israel hope in the Lord from morning watch until night,  
from morning watch.

As you burnt with divine love and were radiant in the Spirit, your  
soul rose to desire truly infinite love. You despised flesh and blood,  
and lived apart from the world, yet you were united to it in great  
silence and abstinence. Therefore, O Anthony, you were satisfied as  
you desired, and illuminate our souls like a star radiant with  
blessings. X2

S3: For there is mercy with the Lord  
and abundant redemption with him.  
He will redeem Israel from all his offences.  
O Anthony, you were radiant with divine light through the grace of  
the Holy Spirit. You shattered the flying weapons of demons and

exposed their evil snares through your divine teaching. You were a  
radiant light for monks as the first to adorn the desert, a prayerful and  
skilful physician of the sick and the first clear example of the ascetic  
life. X2

S2: Every nation, praise the Lord;  
every people, acclaim him!

Christ filled you with divine gifts of grace. When he discovered in  
you a pure mirror of his heavenly and dazzling revelations, he  
radiated the brilliance of his own light on you. Therefore you  
became an overflowing spring of healing, food for the hungry and  
heavenly rain for the thirsty. Because you had the gift of reading  
hearts, you wisely improved them for God through your word. Plead  
with him to enlighten and rescue our souls.

S1: For his mercy is strengthened over us  
and the truth of the Lord remains for ever.  
O Anthony, pure in heart and soul, *you were* an earthly angel, a  
heavenly man, a teacher of chastity and a clear example of  
abstinence. Now, O blessed saint, you live with your Master. As  
you offer him continual praise, together with the angels, all the holy  
monastics and martyrs, liberate from sin and danger those who  
always keep your holy memory.

Glory: Tone 6

You determined to master the disturbing passions and keep the image  
unharmful through the ascetic life. Therefore you rose into the  
perfect likeness, for by bravely restricting nature, you hurried to  
subject what is lower to what is above. You made the body a servant  
of the spirit. Therefore you were revealed as the chief of those living  
the monastic life, a citizen of the desert, a master teaching those who  
hurry to you and a perfect example of virtue. O Anthony, now the  
image has been broken. You see with purity the Holy Trinity in  
heaven as you boldly pray for those who honour you in faith and  
love.

Both now: Tone 7

O Theotokos, you were revealed as a mother above nature, for you  
remained a virgin beyond reason and understanding. No tongue can  
speak about your wonderful childbearing, for the order of nature was  
overruled by God. O pure *Lady*, your conceiving was most glorious.  
O Virgin, the manner of your giving birth was ineffable. We know  
that you are the Mother of God and pray fervently to you, "Plead  
with him to save our souls."

**Phos Ilarón**

P/D: Wisdom! Stand upright!

O Jesus Christ, joyful light of the holy glory  
of the immortal, heavenly, holy, blessed Father,  
when we come to the setting of the sun  
and see the light of evening,  
we praise God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

For it is right at all times to worship you  
with voices of praise,

**Prophecy 1**

From the Wisdom of Solomon (3:1-9)

The souls of the just are in the hand of God and no torment will  
touch them. <sup>2</sup> In the sight of the foolish they seemed to die and their  
departure is taken for misery, <sup>3</sup> and their going from us to be utter  
destruction, but they are in peace. <sup>4</sup> For although they may be  
punished in the sight of men, yet their hope is full of immortality. <sup>5</sup>  
Having been a little disciplined, they will be greatly rewarded, for  
God tested them and found them worthy for himself. <sup>6</sup> Like gold in  
the furnace he has tried them and received them as a burnt offering. <sup>7</sup>

In the time of their visitation they will shine, and run to and fro like sparks among the stubble. <sup>8</sup> They will judge the nations, have dominion over the people, and their Lord will reign for ever. <sup>9</sup> Those who put their trust in him will understand the truth. Those who are faithful in love will live with him, for grace and mercy *belongs* to his saints and he visits his chosen.

### Prophecy 2

From the Wisdom of Solomon (5:15-6:3)

The just live for evermore and their reward is with the Lord, and their care is with the most High. <sup>16</sup> Therefore they will receive a glorious kingdom and a beautiful crown from the Lord's hand, for he will shelter them with his right hand, and protect them with his arm. <sup>17</sup> He will take his fervour to himself for complete armour, and make the creature his weapon for revenge on his enemies. <sup>18</sup> He will put on justice as a breastplate, and judgment as a helmet. <sup>19</sup> He will take holiness for an invincible shield. <sup>20</sup> He will sharpen his severe wrath for a sword; the world will fight with him against the foolish. <sup>21</sup> Then rightly-aimed thunderbolts will go out; from the clouds, as though from a well-drawn bow, they will fly to the mark. <sup>22</sup> Hailstones full of wrath will be fired as though from a stone bow, the water of the sea will rage against them and the rivers will cruelly drown them. <sup>23</sup> Truly a mighty wind will rise against them, and like a storm will blow them away. Therefore lawlessness will lay waste the whole earth, and ill-dealing will overthrow the thrones of the mighty. <sup>1</sup> Hear therefore, O kings, and understand; learn, you who are judges of the ends of the earth. <sup>2</sup> Give ear, you who rule many people and glory in the throng of nations. <sup>3</sup> For might is given to you from the Lord, and sovereignty from the Most High.

### Prophecy 3

From the Wisdom of Solomon (4:7-15)

Although the just may die early, yet he will be at rest. <sup>8</sup> For old age is not honoured for length of time, nor is it measured by the number of years. <sup>9</sup> But wisdom is gray hair for men, and a blameless life is old age. <sup>10</sup> He pleased God and was loved by him, so that while living among sinners he was taken up. <sup>11</sup> He was indeed taken away speedily, in case wickedness should alter his understanding, or deceit beguile his soul. <sup>12</sup> For the fascination of wickedness obscures what is honest, and roving desire undermines the simple mind. <sup>13</sup> Being made perfect in a short time, he lasted for a long time. <sup>14</sup> For his soul pleased the Lord, therefore he hurried to take him away from the wicked. <sup>15</sup> The people saw this, but did not understand it, neither did they place in their minds, that his grace and mercy is with his saints, and that he watches over his chosen.

You have despoiled death by your three days' burial in the tomb. You have raised corrupt man by your life-bearing resurrection. Glory to you, O Christ our God, Lover of the human race!

Both now:

O Virgin-Theotokos, continually pray to Christ our God to save our souls, for he was crucified, rose for us and destroyed the power of death.

### **Kathisma 2**

O Christ our God, while the sepulchre was sealed, you rose from the tomb as Life. While the doors were closed, you stood in the midst of your disciples. O Resurrection of all, you renew a right Spirit within us through them, for you are great in mercy.

Glory:

O King of all, the women ran to the tomb with tears and carried spices, while the soldiers kept their watch over you. They said to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us?" The Angel of Great Counsel has risen and tramples down death. Glory to you, almighty Lord!

Both now:

Hail, O virgin Theotokos, full of grace, harbour and protection for the race of men! The Rescuer of the world was made flesh through you. Only you are both mother and virgin, ever-blessed and glorified. Plead with Christ our God to grant peace to the world.

Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.

The assembly of angels was amazed when it saw you among the dead. O Saviour, by destroying the power of death, you raised Adam with you and freed everyone from Hades.

Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.

The radiant angel cried to the Myrrhbearers from the tomb, "Why do you women mingle myrrh with your tears? Look at the tomb and understand. The Saviour has risen from the tomb."

Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.

The Myrrhbearers ran sorrowfully to your tomb very early in the morning, but an angel came to them and said, "The time for sorrow has come to an end. Do not weep, but announce the resurrection to the apostles."

Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.

The Myrrhbearers were sorrowful as they approached your tomb, but the angel said to them: Why do you number the Living among the dead? As God he has risen from the tomb.

Glory:

We worship the Father, his Son and the Holy Spirit, the Holy Trinity, one in Being. We cry with the Seraphim, "Holy, Holy, Holy are you, O Lord."

Both now:

O Virgin, because you gave birth to the Giver of Life, you rescued Adam from his sin. You gave Eve joy instead of sadness. The Divine Man who was born from you has restored to life those who had fallen from it.

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. Glory to you, O God. (X3)

Everything has its being through the Holy Spirit, for he is God before all, Master of all, unapproachable Light and Life of all.

Antiphon 3 Ps 127

Those who fear the Lord and find the way of life are blessed with undefiled glory both now and forever. As you see your offspring like saplings around your table, rejoice and exult when you offer them to Christ, the Chief Shepherd.

Glory: Both now:

An abundance of graces, the wealth of glory and the great depth of judgments are in the Holy Spirit. We must worship him with the same glory as the Father and the Son.

### Kontákion

*Read without note*

The dominion of death can no longer hold the human race captive, for Christ descended; he shattered and destroyed its powers. Hades is bound, while the prophets rejoice and cry with one voice, "The Saviour has come to those with faith; O faithful, enter the resurrection."

### Íkos

Today death, Hades and the lowest depths of the earth quake with terror at the presence of one of the Trinity. The earth shakes and the gatekeepers of Hades are struck with terror at seeing you. But all creation rejoices with the prophets and sings a song of victory to you, our Redeemer and God, for you destroyed the power of death. Let us also shout and cry aloud to Adam and to those who are sprung from him, "He has introduced the cross to him; O faithful, enter the resurrection."

### Synaxáron

lived in the Fourth Century. After he had heard the words of the Saviour, "Sell all you have and give to the poor," he sold his property, made arrangements for his sister and began to live in a hut. Then he moved to a cave where he was eventually given victory over the demons. After this he moved to an abandoned desert fort where he lived for twenty years before moving further into the desert. His example was a model for future monks and his advice was sought by the crowds. On the Seventeenth he received heaven as his homeland.

Together with him we remember:  
Emperor Theodosios the Great C4  
Hermit and Confessor Achilles of Egypt C5  
Monk Anthony of Berroia C11  
Abbot Anthony of Dymisk C13  
New Martyr George of Yiannina C19  
O God, have mercy on us through their holy prayers. *Amen*.

### Katavasias

1: The sun's rays once shone on dry land in the midst of the deep, for the water on both sides became as firm as a wall while the people crossed over the sea on foot. They offered this song acceptable to God, "Let us sing to the Lord, for he has been greatly glorified."

3: O Lord, *you are* the firm foundation of those who put their trust in you. Strengthen the Church which you have purchased with your precious blood.

4: O Christ, your virtue has covered the heavens, for after you came from your undefiled Mother, the ark of your sanctification, you appeared in the Temple of your glory as a Child in arms and the whole world was filled with your praise.

5: Isaiah symbolically saw God on a throne. He was lifted high and carried in triumph by angels in glory. He cried, "Woe is me, for I have seen the incarnate God beforehand. He is the Lord of the light which knows no evening and the King of peace."

6: When the Elder with his eyes saw the Salvation which had come to the Gentiles, he cried aloud to you, "O Christ, *you* come from God and are my God."

7: O Word of God, you dropped dew on the children as they spoke about divine matters in the midst of the fire. You took up your home in the pure Virgin. We praise you as we sing with devotion, "Blessed are you, O God of our fathers!"

8: Let us praise, bless and worship the Lord. The youths who fought for godliness stood together in the unbearable fire, yet were not harmed by it. They sang a divine hymn, "Bless the Lord, all you his works, and exalt him above all for ever!"

### Eothinón Gospel 10

From the Holy Gospel according to John (21:1-14)

At that time Jesus revealed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he revealed himself in this way. <sup>2</sup> Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples were together. <sup>3</sup> Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat; but that night they caught nothing. <sup>4</sup> Just as day was breaking, Jesus stood on the beach; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. <sup>5</sup> Jesus said to them, "Children, have you any fish?" They answered him, "No." <sup>6</sup> He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in, for the quantity of fish. <sup>7</sup> That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his clothes, for he was stripped for work, and sprang into the sea. <sup>8</sup> But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, but about a hundred yards off. <sup>9</sup> When they got out on land, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish lying on it, and bread. <sup>10</sup> Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." <sup>11</sup> So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred and fifty-three of them; and although there were so many, the net was not torn. <sup>12</sup> Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. <sup>13</sup> Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish. <sup>14</sup> This was now the third time that Jesus was revealed to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

R: Glory to you, O Lord, glory to you.

- <sup>14</sup> Restore your saving joy to me  
and strengthen me with your directing Spirit.
- <sup>15</sup> I will teach the lawless your ways  
and the ungodly will return to you.
- <sup>16</sup> O God, God of my salvation, free me from bloodshed,  
*then* my tongue will rejoice in your justice.
- <sup>17</sup> O Lord, you will open my lips  
and my mouth will announce your praise,
- <sup>18</sup> for if you had wanted sacrifice, I would have given it;  
you will not be pleased with burnt offerings.
- <sup>19</sup> Sacrifice for God is a broken spirit;  
God will not despise a broken and humbled heart.
