Lord I have cried

Tone 8

O Lord, I have cried to you, listen to me;
O Lord, listen to me.

O Lord, I have cried to you, listen to me;
Note the voice of my plea when I cry to you.
O Lord, listen to me.

² Let my prayer be directed before you like incense,
the raising of my hands be an evening sacrifice.
O Lord, listen to me.

S10: Lead my soul from prison that I may acknowledge your name.
O Christ, we offer you our evening hymn and reasonable worship,
for you were pleased to have mercy on us by your resurrection.

S9: The just will wait for me until you reward me.
O Lord *our* Lord, do not banish us from your face, but be pleased to
have mercy on us by the resurrection.

S8: O Lord, I have cried to you from the depths;
O Lord listen to my voice.
Rejoice, O holy Zion, mother of the churches, dwelling place of God!
For you were the first to receive remission of sins by the resurrection.

S7: Let your ears note the voice of my plea.
The Word of God the Father, begotten before the ages, was incarnate
in the latter times from the *woman* who was ignorant of marriage.
He willingly endured crucifixion until death. By his resurrection he
has saved man who was dead from the past.

S6: O Lord, if you mark offences, who will stand?
But there is forgiveness with you.
O Christ, we glorify your resurrection from the dead by which you
have freed the race of Adam from the tortures of Hades. As God you
have granted the world eternal life and great mercy.

S5: O Lord, I have waited for you for your name's sake;
my soul has waited for your word,
my soul has hoped in the Lord.
Glory to you, O Saviour Christ, only begotten Son of God! You
were nailed to the cross and raised from the tomb on the third day!

Tone 4

S4: Let Israel hope in the Lord from morning watch until night,
from morning watch.
O father Gregory, you wisely turned away from the hostile and
treacherous flesh, and mounted the heaven-bound chariot. You were
drawn by the virtues as by though by four horses and soared above
into ineffable beauty. Now, as you delight in it, grant our souls peace
and great mercy.

Tone 2

S3: For there is mercy with the Lord
and abundant redemption with him.
He will redeem Israel from all his offences.
O theologian, you embarked for the heights in your heart after you
had carefully cleansed your body and spirit by your works. You
restrained your mind and entered the opaque and divine cloud. O
Gregory, now that you are in communion with the bodiless Majesty
and lovingly united to him, you cause the unapproachable Light to
shine over everyone.

S2: Every nation, praise the Lord;
every people, acclaim him!
Once the Seraphim used tongs to give the burning charcoal to Isaiah
when he drew near to be initiated into the contemplation of the
thrice-holy Lord who was radiant on his throne of glory. O blessed

theologian, O hierarch Gregory, you have proclaimed the Three-
person Nature of the Divinity to the Church and used your hands to
give believers the divine Coal whom we celebrate in two Natures.

S1: For his mercy is strengthened over us
and the truth of the Lord remains for ever.

O blessed Gregory, it is correct for us to call you "Son of Thunder"
and "Theologian" for you shared in the divine grace of holy John.
With your voice of thunder and your tongue of fire you proclaimed
the eternally-begotten Word of God who was with the Father in the
beginning. *You announced* the Spirit who eternally proceeds from
the Father and is of one Being with the Father and the Son.

Glory: Tone 8

O holy theologian Gregory, your tongue, which is always prepared
and ready to teach, echoes in our hearts and wakes the souls of the
most slothful *people*. They find a ladder in your divine words which
leads them from earth to God. Therefore we implore you to plead
with Christ to rescue our souls from every danger.

Both now: Tone 8

The King of Heaven, appeared on earth and lived with men because
of his love for the human race. He took flesh from the pure Virgin
and, after he had assumed it, came from her. The Son is one in two
Natures, yet one Person. Therefore we truly proclaim him as perfect
God and perfect man, and we acknowledge Christ as our God. O
unwedded Mother, plead with him to have mercy on our souls.

Phos Ilarón

P/D: Wisdom! Stand upright!
O Jesus Christ, joyful light of the holy glory
of the immortal, heavenly, holy, blessed Father,
when we come to the setting of the sun
and see the light of evening,
we praise God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

For it is right at all times to worship you
with voices of praise,
O Son of God *and* Giver of life.

Therefore the world glorifies you.

P/D: The Evening Prokeimenon
R: The Lord reigns *and* is clothed with majesty.
S1: The Lord has put on power and clothed himself.
S2: He founded the world, which will not be moved.

2: From the Book of Wisdom (4:7-15)

The just man will be at rest
although he dies early.
⁸For old age is not honoured for length of time,
nor measured by number of years;
⁹but understanding is grey hair for men,
and a blameless life is ripe old age.
¹⁰There was one who pleased God and was loved by him,
and while living among sinners he was taken up.
¹¹He was caught in case evil change his understanding
or guile deceive his soul.
¹²For the fascination of wickedness obscures what is good
and roving desire perverts the innocent mind.
¹³Being perfected in a short time,
he fulfilled long years;
¹⁴for his soul was pleasing to the Lord,
therefore he took him quickly from the midst of wickedness.
¹⁵Yet the peoples saw and did not understand,
nor take such a thing to heart,
that God's grace and mercy are with his elect,
and he watches over his holy ones.

3: From the Book of Proverbs (Composite)

The mouth of the just produces wisdom,
but the perverse tongue will be cut off.
³²The lips of the just know what is acceptable,
but the mouth of the wicked, what is perverse.
⁴Riches do not profit on the day of wrath,
but justice rescues from death.
⁷When the wicked dies, his hope perishes,
and the expectation of the godless comes to nothing.
¹⁹Whoever is steadfast in justice will live,
but whoever pursues evil will die.
²From the fruit of his mouth a good man eats good,
but the desire of the treacherous is for violence.
⁹The light of the just rejoices,
but the lamp of the wicked will be put out.
¹⁷I love those who love me;
those who seek me diligently find me.
²The tongue of the wise dispenses knowledge,
but the mouths of fools pour out folly.
³³Wisdom abides in the mind of a man of understanding,
but it is not known in the heart of fools.
¹¹Whoever loves purity of heart and whose speech is gracious,
will have the king as his friend.
¹Who is like the wise man?
And who knows the interpretation of a thing?
^{1b}A man's wisdom makes his face shine,
and the hardness of his countenance is changed.
¹³She hurries to make herself known
to those who desire her.
¹²Wisdom is radiant and unfading;
she is easily discerned by those who love her
and is found by those who seek her.
¹⁴The person who rises early to seek her will have no difficulty,
for he will find her sitting at his gates.
¹⁵To fix one's thought on her is perfect understanding
and whoever is vigilant about her will soon be free from care,

¹⁶because she goes about seeking those worthy of her;
she graciously appears to them in their paths
and meets them in every thought.

³⁰For the light is succeeded by night,
but evil does not prevail against wisdom.

²I loved her and sought her from my youth;
I desired to take her for my bride
and I fell in love with her beauty.

³She glorifies her noble birth by living with God
and the Lord of all loves her.

⁴For she is an initiate in the knowledge of God,
and an associate in his works.

⁷If anyone loves justice, her labours are virtues;
for she teaches self-control, prudence, justice and courage;
nothing in life is more profitable for men than these.

⁸If anyone longs for wide experience,
she knows the events of old,
and deduces the things to come.

She understands turns of speech
and the solutions of riddles.

She has foreknowledge of signs and wonders
and of the outcome of seasons and times.

⁹Therefore I determined to take her to live with me,
knowing that she would give me good counsel
and encouragement in cares and grief.

¹⁷When I considered these things inwardly,
and thought about them with my mind,
that there is immortality in affinity with wisdom,

¹⁸that there is pure delight in friendship with her,
that there is unfailing wealth in the labours of her hands,
that there is understanding in the experience of her company,
and renown in sharing her words,

I went about seeking how to get her for myself.

¹⁹As a child I was naturally well endowed
and a good soul fell to my lot;

²⁰or rather, being good,
I entered an undefiled body.

²¹But I perceived that I would not possess wisdom
unless God gave her to me

and it was a mark of insight to know whose gift she was.

²²So I appealed to the Lord and pleaded with him,
and spoke with my whole heart.

¹O God of my fathers and Lord of mercy,
you have made all things by your word.

²You have formed man by your wisdom,
to govern the creatures which you have made,

³rule the world in holiness and justice,
and give judgement in integrity of soul.

⁴Give me the wisdom that sits beside your throne,
and do not reject me from among your servants.

⁵For I am your slave and the son of your maid servant,
a man who is weak and short-lived,

with little understanding of judgement and laws.

¹⁰Send her forth from the holy heavens,
and from the throne of thy glory send her,
that she may be with me and toil,

and that I may learn what is pleasing to thee.

¹¹For she knows and understands all things
and she will guide me wisely in my actions

and guard me with her glory.

¹⁴For the reasoning of mortals is worthless,
and our designs are likely to fail,

O Virgin Theotokos, you are most glorious. We praise you, for Hades has been laid low and death has been slain through the cross of your Son. We were dead in sin, but have risen and been granted life. We have obtained Paradise, our former delight, therefore we thank and glorify Christ our God, for he alone is mighty and great in mercy.

Kathísmá 2

You did not prevent the stone of the tomb from being sealed; you rose and granted the rock of faith to everyone. O Lord, glory to you.

Glory:

The choir of the disciples, joined the myrrhbearing women and rejoiced in unison. Therefore, together with them, we keep the feast to glorify and honour your resurrection. O Lord and Lover of the human race, grant your people great mercy through them.

Both now:

O Virgin Theotokos, you are most blessed, for Hades has been captured through the *Lord* who was born from you. Adam has been recalled, the curse has been annulled, Eve has been set free, death has been slain and we have been granted life. Therefore we cry, "Blessed is Christ our God, who was so well-pleased! Glory to you!"

The radiant angel cried to the Myrrhbearers from the tomb, "Why do you women mingle myrrh with your tears? Look at the tomb and understand. The Saviour has risen from the tomb."

Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.

The Myrrhbearers ran sorrowfully to your tomb very early in the morning, but an angel came to them and said, "The time for sorrow has come to an end. Do not weep, but announce the resurrection to the apostles."

Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.

The Myrrhbearers were sorrowful as they approached your tomb, but the angel said to them: Why do you number the Living among the dead? As God he has risen from the tomb.

Glory:

We worship the Father, his Son and the Holy Spirit, the Holy Trinity, one in Being. We cry with the Seraphim, "Holy, Holy, Holy are you, O Lord."

Both now:

O Virgin, because you gave birth to the Giver of Life, you rescued Adam from his sin. You gave Eve joy instead of sadness. The Divine Man who was born from you has restored to life those who had fallen from it.

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. Glory to you, O God. (X3)

O our God and our hope, glory to you.

Small Litany

Kontákion

Read without note

O almighty Saviour, Hades became afraid when it saw the miracle of your resurrection from the tomb. The dead rose and creation, together with Adam, saw this and rejoiced together with you. My Saviour, the world praises you for ever.

Íkos

O Saviour, you are the light of those in darkness; you are the resurrection of everyone and the life of mortals. O Word, when you despoiled the might of death and shattered the gates of Hades, you raised us all with you. O Lover of the human race, the dead saw this and wondered at the miracle and all creation rejoiced together at your resurrection. Therefore, my Saviour, we also glorify and praise your condescension and the world praises you for ever.

Synaxárión

Today we remember our father among the saints Gregory the Theologian, Archbishop of Constantinople, who lived in the Fourth Century. He studied at Athens with his life-long friend Basil the Great, then joined a monastic community with him. His father, the Bishop of Nazianzos, compelled him to accept ordination as a priest. He was consecrated as Bishop of Sasima, but returned to Nazianzos. After he had moved to the imperial capital he took charge of the Orthodox parishes. After the Arians had been expelled he was elected as Archbishop and made important contributions to the debates of the Second Oecumenical Council. He cared little for the politics of his office and again retired to Nazianzos. He died on the Twenty Fifth.

Katavasías

1: The sun's rays once shone on dry land in the midst of the deep, for the water on both sides became as firm as a wall while the people crossed over the sea on foot. They offered this song acceptable to God, "Let us sing to the Lord, for he has been greatly glorified."

3: O Lord, *you are* the firm foundation of those who put their trust in you. Strengthen the Church which you have purchased with your precious blood.

4: O Christ, your virtue has covered the heavens, for after you came from your undefiled Mother, the ark of your sanctification, you appeared in the Temple of your glory as a Child in arms and the whole world was filled with your praise.

5: Isaiah symbolically saw God on a throne. He was lifted high and carried in triumph by angels in glory. He cried, "Woe is me, for I have seen the incarnate God beforehand. He is the Lord of the light which knows no evening and the King of peace."

6: When the Elder with his eyes saw the Salvation which had come to the Gentiles, he cried aloud to you, "O Christ, *you* come from God and are my God."

7: O Word of God, you dropped dew on the children as they spoke about divine matters in the midst of the fire. You took up your home in the pure Virgin. We praise you as we sing with devotion, "Blessed are you, O God of our fathers!"

8: Let us praise, bless and worship the Lord. The youths who fought for godliness stood together in the unbearable fire, yet were not harmed by it. They sang a divine hymn, "Bless the Lord, all you his works, and exalt him above all for ever!"

Eothinón Gospel 11

From the Holy Gospel according to John (21:15-25)

At that time Jesus revealed himself to his disciples after he had risen from the dead. And he said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Feed my lambs." ¹⁶ A second time he said to him, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Tend my sheep." ¹⁷ He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was grieved because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep." ¹⁸ Truly, truly, I say to you, when you were young, you girded yourself and walked where you would; but when you are old, you will stretch out your hands, and another will gird you and carry you where you do not wish to go." ¹⁹ (This he said to show by what death he was to glorify God.) And after this he said to him, "Follow me." ²⁰ Peter turned and saw following them the disciple whom Jesus loved, who had lain close to his breast at the supper and had said, "Lord, who is it that is going to betray you?" ²¹ When Peter saw him, he said to Jesus, "Lord, what about this man?" ²² Jesus said to him, "If it is my will that he remain until I come, what is that to you? Follow me!" ²³ The saying spread abroad among the brothers that this disciple was not to die; yet Jesus did not say to him that he was not to die, but, "If it is my will that he remain until I come, what

is that to you?" ²⁴ This is the disciple who is bearing witness to these things, and who has written these things; and we know that his testimony is true. ²⁵ But there are also many other things which Jesus did; were every one of them to be written, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written. Amen.

R: Glory to you, O Lord, glory to you.
