Lord I have cried

Tone 2

O Lord, I have cried to you, listen to me;
O Lord, listen to me.
O Lord, I have cried to you, listen to me;
Note the voice of my plea when I cry to you.
O Lord, listen to me.

² Let my prayer be directed before you like incense,
the raising of my hands be an evening sacrifice.
O Lord, listen to me.

S10: Lead my soul from prison that I may acknowledge your name.
Come and worship the Word of God *who was* begotten by the Father
before all ages and became incarnate from the Virgin Mary. When he had
endured the cross, he was buried, as he himself desired. When he rose
from the dead, he saved me, for I had strayed.

S9: The just will wait for me until you reward me.
Christ our Saviour nailed the bond against us to the cross; he made it of no
effect and destroyed the power of death. We fall down before his
resurrection on the third day.

S8: O Lord, I have cried to you from the depths;
O Lord listen to my voice.

Together with the archangels, let us praise the resurrection of Christ. He is
our Saviour and Redeemer. He is coming with awesome glory and mighty
power to judge the world which he formed.

S7: Let your ears note the voice of my plea.

The angel proclaimed you as the crucified and buried Master. He said to the women, “Come and see the place where he lay. He has risen, as he said, for he is almighty.” Only immortal *Lord*, we worship you. O Christ, Giver of life, have mercy on us.

S6: O Lord, if you mark offences, who will stand?

But there is forgiveness with you.

You destroyed the curse of the tree by your cross. You destroyed the might of death by your burial. You enlightened the human race by your rising. O Benefactor, Christ our God, glory to you!

Tone 1

S5: O Lord, I have waited for you for your name’s sake;
my soul has waited for your word,
my soul has hoped in the Lord.

The earth allotted to us was rich and fertile, but all we planted were the seeds of sin. We reaped the sheaves of evil with the sickle of laziness. We failed to place them on the threshing-floor of sorrow. Now we implore you, O Lord, eternal Master of the harvest, “May your love become the breeze to winnow the straw of our worthless deeds. Make us like precious wheat to be stored in heaven and save us all.”

S4: Let Israel hope in the Lord from morning watch until night,
from morning watch.

Let us begin to sing and raise the hymn of salvation with our mouths. All you people, come, fall down, worship in the house of the Lord and say, “Cleanse our sins, for you were crucified on the tree, rose from the dead and are in the bosom of the Father.”

Tone 8

S3: For there is mercy with the Lord
and abundant redemption with him.
He will redeem Israel from all his offences.

O Simeon, tell us whom you bear in your arms who *makes* you rejoice so greatly in the Temple? To whom do you shout and cry aloud, “Now I am set free for I have seen my Saviour?” This is the one who was born from a Virgin; this is the *Lord* who is the Word, and God from God. He has assumed flesh and saved man for our sake; let us **worship him**.

S2: Every nation, praise the Lord;
every people, acclaim him!

O Simeon, receive the *Lord*, whom Moses once saw in darkness, when he granted the Law on Sinai. He has now become a baby subject to the Law, yet this is the *Lord* who spoke through the Law. This is the one whose voice was heard in the prophets. He has assumed flesh and saved man for our sake; let us worship him!

S1: For his mercy is strengthened over us
and the truth of the Lord remains for ever.

Come and let us also go to meet Christ with divine songs. Let us receive the *Lord* whose salvation Simeon saw. This is the one whom David announced; this is the one whose words the prophets spoke. He has assumed flesh and speaks to us in the Law for our sake; let us worship him.

Glory: Tone 2

I have forsaken such great blessings, wretch that I am! I have miserably fallen from such a kingdom, squandered the riches which were given me and broken the commandments. Woe is me when I am condemned to eternal fire! O my soul, cry out to Christ before the end approaches. “O God, receive me like the Prodigal and have mercy on me.”

Both now: Tone 2

The shadow of the Law passed when grace came. As the bush burned, yet was not consumed, so the Virgin gave birth, yet remained a virgin. The Sun of justice has risen instead of a pillar of flame and Christ, the salvation of our souls, instead of Moses.

We worship the Father, his Son and the Holy Spirit, the Holy Trinity, one in Being. We cry with the Seraphim, “Holy, Holy, Holy are you, O Lord.”

Both now:

O Virgin, because you gave birth to the Giver of Life, you rescued Adam from his sin. You gave Eve joy instead of sadness. The Divine Man who was born from you has restored to life those who had fallen from it.

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. Glory to you, O God. (X3)

O our God and our hope, glory to you.

Without note

O Father, I have recklessly forgotten your glory and wasted in sin the riches which you gave me. Now I cry to you like the Prodigal, “O merciful Father, I have sinned before you. Receive me as a penitent and make me as one of your hired servants.”

Íkos

Every day our Saviour teaches us with his own voice, so let us listen to the Scriptures on the Prodigal Son who regained wisdom. Let us follow the good example of his repentance with faith. Let us cry out with humility of heart to the *Lord* who knows all secrets, “O merciful Father, we have sinned against you and are unworthy ever again to be called your children as before. But since you are the Lover of the human race by nature, receive me as a penitent, and make me as one of your hired servants.”

Synaxarion

Today we remember the holy and renowned great martyr Theodore, the general of the armies, who lived in Ieraklía during the Fourth Century. He was beaten, torn with hooks, crucified and finally beheaded. On the Eighth he bent his neck to the sword in his great love for God.

On the same day we remember the holy prophet Zechariah who lived in the Fourth Century before Christ. He saw the angels as horses and rose to heaven on them.

Ypómnima

Today we commemorate the parable of the which comes in the noble gospel and which our divine Fathers placed in the Triodion. O you, who are a prodigal, like me, come forward with confidence and tranquillity, for the door of divine mercy has been opened for everyone. Therefore, O Christ our God, in your ineffable love for the human race, have mercy on us. Amen.

Katavasías

1: The sun's rays once shone on dry land in the midst of the deep, for the water on both sides became as firm as a wall while the people crossed over the sea on foot. They offered this song acceptable to God, “Let us sing to the Lord, for he has been greatly glorified.”

3: O Lord, *you are* the firm foundation of those who put their trust in you. Strengthen the Church which you have purchased with your precious blood.

4: O Christ, your virtue has covered the heavens, for after you came from your undefiled Mother, the ark of your sanctification, you appeared in the Temple of your glory as a Child in arms and the whole world was filled with your praise.

The youths who fought for godliness stood together in the unbearable fire, yet were not harmed by it. They sang a divine hymn, “Bless the Lord, all you his works, and exalt him above all for ever!”

When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. ² And very early on the first day of the week they went to the tomb when the sun had risen. ³ And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the door of the tomb?" ⁴ And looking up, they saw that the stone was rolled back; -- it was very large. ⁵ And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe; and they were amazed. ⁶ And he said to them, "Do not be amazed; you seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen, he is not here; see the place where they laid him. ⁷ But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him, as he told you." ⁸ And they went out quickly and fled from the tomb; for

trembling and astonishment had come upon them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

Gospel

From the Holy Gospel according to Luke (15:11-32)
